

Message from the President



In 2016 we made extraordinary progress in making ISHK's work available online to anyone in the world at any time; not only to a professional psychologist, but to a student in China; not only to a parent who buys a book, but to a curious young girl in rural India. *Anywhere there's a connection.*

We have shifted our efforts away from providing individual, physical items — shipping a million books through the ISHK Book Service — to developing new content and new ideas.

The Human Journey website now offers a multidisciplinary, more complete understanding of who we are and what we are capable of becoming. Our journey moves from our distant ancestors, surveying our biological and social evolution and travels through early settlements, civilizations and major religions, exploring the beginning of our lives, our biological inheritance, modern neuroscience, anthropology, medicine, evolutionary biology, neuroscience, ecology, as well as economics, education and international aid. It offers works both for the general public and for advanced professionals. ... To link an understanding of our deep past to a future where humanity can unite around a common higher persepctive. It's what ISHK has been working toward for 45 years.

A major effort is well underway to make that content more accessible and more available. This involves considerable work, rewriting the content to reach a wider audience, work on "analytics," and the technical efforts to determine who visits our site, how long they stay, on what they focus, to help us improve the use of the material.

We also continued our efforts to expand the Hoopoe children's books into more language editions, to more countries and regions within those countries, providing thousands more books to underserved children throughout the world (including those at home). We continue to provide information to psychologists about new developments.

As always, we could not have accomplished our work without the help of The Will J. Reid Foundation who has supported ISHK for more than a dozen years, as well as the help of many generous donors and extraordinary volunteers around the country and the world -- all who aim to maintain the mission of ISHK to allow us all to change, adapt and care for ourselves and the planet on which we all live.

Key 2016 Accomplishments

Thanks once more to the generous support of The Will J. Reid Foundation (WJRF) since 2002, and to the generous donations and volunteer services from so many individuals, we were able to achieve significant advances in 2016.

HOOPOE BOOKS: In 2016, Hoopoe initiated a new program in support of the internationally recognized "Mother Tongue-Based Multi-Lingual Education," to provide as many bilingual books and teacher guides in the *lingua franca* and minority tongues of Afghanistan and Pakistan as funds will allow. We also began production of bilingual titles for the Afghan and Pakistani diasporas with English as the second language, and Arabic-English titles for refugees children from Syria and Iraq.

SHARE LITERACY: We continued our program through strategic book and teacher materials placement in more than 94 programs around the USA, as well as in Canada and Mexico.

BOOKS FOR AFGHANISTAN: Thanks to our implementing partners in Kabul, we have now distributed over 4.4 million books in Dari-Pashto and English since January 2007 when we began this program. In 2016, 142,311 Hoopoe Books were distributed by our partners to the Afghan Mobile Mini Children's Circus, and to three mobile children's libraries.

BOOKS FOR PAKISTAN: A new website for this program was launched in 2016. Since its start in 2010 we have printed and distributed almost 100,000 Hoopoe Books by Idries Shah in English-Urdu, Urdu-Pashto and Urdu-Sindhi editions.

eBOOKS NEWS: In 2016 all Hoopoe titles by Idries Shah were made available in English eBook editions for Amazon Kindle and Apple iBooks.

CE@HOME FOR PSYCHOLOGISTS: This year, we've added more titles and new categories on mind-fulness, empathy, attachment theory, and psycho-dynamic psychotherapy.

CME FOR PHYSICIANS: We began this program in 2012 in partnership with the Dartmouth-Hitchcock Medical Center and it now includes 15 courses available online from our Website.

THE HUMAN JOURNEY: Stimulated in part by the new findings that trace all non-Africans today to a single population emerging from Africa 80 - 50 thousand years ago, we revised the *Our Distant Ancestors* section and began a new mobile friendly, easily accessible design of the website. We also completed sections on *Education in the Modern World, International Aid,* and a piece on *The Economics of Renewable Energy,* as well as reports on several seminal works, such as: *Capital in the Twenty-First Century* by Thomas Piketty.

ISHK ADMINISTRATION: The ISHK Book Service is now run via our online web services. All titles from both ISHK imprints, Hoopoe Books and Malor Books, are now available directly through our website and orders fulfilled by Amazon and Ingram.

This year we released Spanish-only and English-Urdu editions of Idries Shah's Hoopoe titles.

A New Book on Spirituality

God 4.0



This book by Robert Ornstein is in the drafting and it is hoped that it will be finished in 2017 and published in the following year. God 4.0 unites findings on the origins of humanity, the ancient temples, the Neolithic revolution, modern religions, current psychology, anthropology and neuroscience and religious studies. Taken together this wealth of material strongly suggests that "knowing God" is a further development of cognition that opens an extra-dimension latent in consciousness. The common element that's already a part of us is a set of connections in the brain that have the potential to reach for this extended perception. This new explanation is in no way a reduction of the majesty of religion, but instead a rectification of the inflated terms that have come down to us: "angels," "Heaven and Hell" - themselves metaphors upon metaphor.

Seen in this light, one can understand sayings of Jesus, Moses, Mohammed and others in a new way. For instance, Jesus's words: "the ... Kingdom is spread out upon the earth, and people do not see it." Colloquially, this is a way of saying, "It's not what you believe, it's what you perceive." It is a reminder that a wider perception is much, much closer to everyday experience than most people believe.

While innate, this faculty is usually not fully developed, just as many other human capacities lie dormant in many of us. All human beings, for example, can speak and understand language, but to write it and read it demands a lot of teaching, and to write like James Joyce needs a combination of talents. Similarly, all human beings can understand the concept "one, two and many" for quantity, but to learn arithmetic, algebra, geometry and calculus demands a lot of work. And beyond that there are the divas of math such as Newton and Ramanujan. So all of us have a nascent, intuitive sense which is the basis of spirituality. The capacity for an expanded consciousness of the connectedness of all life is like these other faculties - a part of everyone's natural endowment and something that can be developed.

Development of this particular faculty is sometimes called "wisdom," "perspective," "the third eye," deep or direct perception, or "seeing God." Fortunately, the neuropsychology of this faculty is now becoming understandable, which opens that process and progress to many of us rather than (as in the past) to a select few. Such an approach is now urgently needed, and as our view of consciousness and its possibilities changes, so too will our understanding of religion and science – something that could have far-reaching effects on our common human future.

Share Literacy is now in its 17th year of operation, and during that period has distributed more than 730,000 books to schools, early child development centers, youth programs, homeless shelters, hospitals & clinics, and community service centers, etc., in the USA, Canada, Mexico, Africa, and Haiti. These organizations (some of the most current are listed on the next page) depend on our help every year to brighten up the lives of the children they serve. Educators around the country continue to use our excellent standards-aligned teacher lesson plans available as free downloads on the www.hoopoebooks.com site.

Throughout these years, with the help of donors and volunteers, through the Hoopoe Share Literacy Holiday and other give-away programs, we have given Hoopoe books and kits in English and Spanish-English bilingual editions to young children in programs all over the country. A special printing of 20,400 books was ordered in November this year and delivered in January 2017 to the Chapters in California, Massachusetts, and D.C., and will be distributed by volunteers throughout 2017. In addition, ICE volunteers in Canada will be distributing 12,600 copies of The Farmer's Wife by Idries Shah to schools and organizations serving at-risk children in Canada.





Books for Afghanistan - www.booksforafghanistan.org



This project was conceived back in 2005 and implemented in 2007 as a way to "repatriate" the Hoopoe stories collected by Idries Shah by providing them, with ancillary teacher guides, as illustrated bilingual Dari-Pashto and English paperbacks for the children of Afghanistan as an aid to literacy.

Thanks to grants and to the generosity of our supporters, we have now distributed over 4.4 million Hoopoe books in Dari-Pashto and English since January 2007 when we first obtained the Afghan Ministry of Education (MOE) approval to provide these books and began our program.

In spite of increased security issues, and the constant disruption program on our website of electrical power by Taliban insurgents, our intrepid partners, Khatiz Organization for Rehabilitation, distributed another 142,311 books this year, mostly to three mobile libraries which ensures that every book gets read by multiple children.

HADIA/Moska Mobile Library, the largest mobile library in Afghanistan, distributed books in Kabul, Nangarhar, Herat and Wardak provinces.

"... in most areas of Afghanistan once girls reach the age of puberty, they are usually stopped by their families from going to school and are inside their houses all the time. What we have been noticing is that such girls are also getting the benefit of our mobile library. They stand at the doorstep of their houses and send their young siblings to the librarian and ask for books. I can imagine, it would be hard for them to have been educated to the extent that they can read and write and then not have access to anything to read. So Hoopoe books bring them that joy of books. Our librarian in Nangrahar has received letters of thanks from some of such girls, which gives me (at a personal level) a lot of satisfaction as we are able to operate within the norms of Afghanistan traditions and yet reach out to young girls and ladies with these books. 
Since 2012, Afghan Mini Mobile Children's Circus (MMCC) has distributed Hoopoe books to children at their circus events, in their education centers, in schools and orphanages as they travel around entertaining children throughout Afghanistan. In June we were able to provide the Afghan MMCC with another 20,000 Hoopoe Books which were distributed to young audiences in Herat Province.

We now have a website for Books for Pakistan: Visit our new mobile-friendly new website for more information on our program, and our progress throughout next year.

Since this program began in 2011, we have printed a total of **100,000 English-Urdu**, Urdu-Pashto and Urdu-Sindhi editions of Hoopoe children's Teaching-Stories by Idries Shah.

Our major effort this year, with our partners Alif Laila Book Bus Society, was to donate a set of 10 Hoopoe Books and puppets to all 3,809 BECS schools in Balochistan, Sindh, Federally Administered Tribal Areas (FATA) and Southern Punjab. These BECS programs for out-of-school children are an innovative initiative taken by the Government of Pakistan. Their goal is to strengthen non-formal approaches to supplement formal education for the eradication of illiteracy and the achievement of Universal Primary Education (UPE). 80% of BECS teachers/staff and 60% of students are female.


2017 began with excellent news from an unsolicited letter from Muhammad Suhail, the Assistant Director of the FATA Ministry of Federal Education in Pakistan. Since the Hoopoe books arrived in the FATA BECS schools, attendance increased from 60-70% up to 100% because all the children wanted to read them and play with the puppets.

Our Continuing Education informs the teachers who influence future generations. ISHK has concentrated on the mind in many aspects of our work, and this program, directed by Charles Swencionis, offers ideas not often presented to working professionals.

We're pleased that this project continues to change the minds of professionals, here's one quote referring to *The Archaeology of Mind: Neuroevolutionary Origins of Human Emotions* by Jaak Panksepp and Lucy Biven **"A whole new way of thinking about mental states. Excellent!"**

This year psychologists took about 2000 courses and some very important books were added, for example: Why Torture Doesn't Work: The Neuroscience of Interrogation; The Male Brain; The African American Child; Social; Neurotribes; Big Dreams: The Science of Dreaming and the Origins of Religion; The Wisest One in the Room: How You Can Benefit from Social Psychology's Most Powerful Insights. We are currently adding: Big Gods: How Religion Transformed Cooperation and Conflict; Consciousness and the Brain: Deciphering How the Brain Codes our Thoughts; The Feeling Brain: The Biology and Psychology of Emotions; The Self Illusion: How the Social Brain Creates Identity. All highly recommended, interesting reads.

We began this program in 2012 in partnership with the Dartmouth-Hitchcock Medical Center and Dartmouth Medical School in order to broaden the base of information relating to physician practice. ISHK is founded upon taking a multiple-discipline approach to the questions of who we are, where we came from, and what we might become. Looking at ourselves from all angles, from contemporary psychology, education, anthropology, medicine, evolutionary biology, neuroscience, and ecology as well as from traditional systems of knowledge, **The Human Journey** is where we have put it all together.

A lot has happened on the site this year:

• Studies were published by three separate teams confirming that all non-Africans today trace their ancestry to a single population, emerging from Africa between 80,000 and 50,000 years ago. In the light of these and other new findings, we have revised the initial section *Our Distant Ancestors*.

• We completed the section on *Education in the Modern World,* providing an overview of how education has and should be developed and an examination of what programs prepare people, both rich and poor, for the modern world. Included in this section are reports on two important works: *One World Schoolhouse: Education Reimagined* by Salman Khan and *Improbable Scholars: The Rebirth of a Great American School System* by the nationally known education expert David L. Kip.

• We also completed a comprehensive overview of International AID, its history, benefits and disadvantages, examining what works, what doesn't work, and why.

• And we added a piece on *The Economics of Renewable Energy*, as well as reports on several seminal works, such as: *Capital in the Twenty-First Century* by Thomas Piketty.

A redesigned website has begun -

Technology and accessibility to informational websites have transformed since ISHK began the site in 2010. So, we are currently redesigning our website, providing a new authoritative and welcoming design that will attract and stimulate inquisitive minds, young and old. 
The new Homepage of **The Human Journey** website

ISHK's Malor Books imprint was launched in 1995 to keep seminal works in print that would otherwise not be available. Malor Books publications are used in hundreds of university courses around the world.

In order to ensure that the information contained in these definitive titles remains available for future generations, Malor Books continued making works available through online stores. Amazon's Kindle, Google Books, and other eBooks sites now have many of the Malor Books in digital editions available for purchase. ISHK Administration Changes

Since 2013, our administrative address in Los Altos is 171 Main Street #140, Los Altos, CA 94022. We have closed both our Los Altos and Cambridge offices. Our book and program fulfillment operations are now run through our website and Ingram and Amazon online services.

Our paid staff is now reduced to part-time individuals, who all work many more hours pro bono than they should, and we are fortunate to receive additional help from old and new volunteers who assist in a million significant ways. They run the CE@Home programs, maintain our 5 websites, write articles for and redesign the new Human Journey website, provide public relations support for new Hoopoe editions, maintain Hoopoe Facebook and social media, undertake grant research and writing, provide translation, editorial, graphic and layout assistance, write and edit teacher guides and lesson plans, and run book donation chapters for Share Literacy.

We could not run ISHK without this extraordinary help and without the support of our donors.

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
